Ten Commandments for a Healthy Heart

- 1. Know your risk factors for heart disease.
- 2. Talk to your doctor about reducing your risk of heart disease.
 - 3. Have your blook pressure checked regularly.
- Know your cholesterol numbers. (These include total cholesterol, HDL or "good" cholesterol, LDL or "bad" cholesterol and triglycerides.)
 - 5. Have your blood sugar level checked for diabetes.
 - 6. Do not smoke cigarettes or use other tobacco products.
 - 7. East for your heart health.
 - 8. Get regular physical activity. (At least 30 minutes of moderate physical activity on most of all days of the week.)
 - 9. Aim for a healthy weight.
 - 10. Know the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and the importance of seeking medical help immediately.

The Heart Truth is: Heart Disease doesn't care what you wear, it's the #1 killer of women. That's why the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, part of the National Institutes of Health, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services is sponsoring *The Heart Truth*, a national awareness campaign for women about heart disease.

The campaign warns women about heart disease and provides tools to help them take action against its risk factors. Its message is paired with an arresting visual - the Red Dress - that serves as the national symbol for women and heart disease awareness.

The market performed well last year and the growth rate for the Fund in 2010 was 12.46%. Reportedly the prospect for the market for the next few years is good. Our contributions were not as large as in most previous years. It would be great to increase our donations.

The Capital Fund Committee wants to thank the faithful, regular contributors to the Fund; their support is greatly appreciated. The Committee urges all constituents of Faith UMC to support the Fund. We are anxious to reach our goal of \$300,000 and close the Capital Fund project.

As we often mention, our Fund is deposited with the Nebraska United Methodist Foundation in Lincoln; the Foundation's agent is the Union Bank of Trust Company of Lincoln. Jim Heller, the Foundation's recent executive director, has retired. His successor is Anita Crisp.

CALL TO ORDER/PRAYER: Karen called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Pastor Michelle gave the prayer. Pastor Michelle announced we had approx. 20 new members in 2010. Annette will put names and photos on the bulletin board. The newsletter has been emailed/mailed out. Dayla will send an email out to remind members about signing up for the email version. Pastor Michelle and Karen talked about the book "Who Stole My Church" by Gordon McDonald. Karen would like to offer this as a book club discussion.

FINANCIAL REPORT: (Sue Divan) Our beginning balance for 2011 is \$-11,259.68. Pledges plus additional fundraising should allow us to meet our 2011 budget. We need to watch our spending very closely. Suggestions were made concerning control of unnecessary spending. Karen assigned this to Finance Committee to work out and report back in February.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

CAMPUS MINISTRY: (Pastor Michelle) Youth will be doing the worship service on Jan. 23rd. Will be a fundraiser with a container at the back of the church for donations; Lee McQueen Burrito Bash was suggested as a fundraising event for UCM. District aid to UCM is increasing in 2011.

CAPITAL FUND: (Pastor Michelle) Otto is working on a letter to be sent out to members who might want to remember Faith Church in their estate giving.

CARING AND SHARING: (Dayla Rhodus) Add Kathe Cox to the list.


