
- 1. Pray for wisdom that the values you currently hold are value that are pleasing to God.

6. Seek excellence in all you do.


- 7. Teach your children to love life.

The Yard Sale yielded &915.46 and thirty households made generous donations on Sunday. The result enabled the Capital Fund to grow by \$5151.51. Our total has now reached \$47,123.01 which leaves us short of our goal of \$50,000 by only \$3000. We had a very fantastic weekend.


