

Eat Better

Navigating the Holiday Dessert Table

There's a good chance many of us will attend a holiday party or two (or three!) this season. Be realistic and know there will probably be an abundance of good food to enjoy. Come prepared with a game plan. Before digging into the buffet, especially the dessert buffet, think through your strategy:

- 1. Give yourself permission. Know that walking past the dessert table isn't realistic for many of us. Instead of planning to completely avoid desserts, allow yourself a small taste. You can satisfy your craving in a healthy way without having to spend the evening fighting temptation.
- 2. Leave room. You know you'll want some pie after dinner, so plan ahead. Ask for a smaller dinner plate and be mindful of your portion sizes. Remember to eat slowly and pass on seconds. You'll be able to enjoy dessert much more if you don't feel uncomfortably full beforehand.
- 3. Choose wisely. The dessert table has so many delicious options, so take your time selecting. Only choose one or two favorites or those treats that only appear once a year.
- 4. Sit down. When you've chosen your dessert, make sure you find a seat before engaging in conversation. Standing and talking while eating increases the likelihood that you'll lose track of how much you've consumed.




Ways to Increase Worship

Attendance

Make worship Accessible to Newcomers



- 2. Preach sermons that don't assume familiarity with the inner workings of the church or a high level of previous biblical knowledge.
- 3. Consider adding an additional worship service to reach new people who would prefer a different time; or to reach new people who would prefer a different style of worship and music.
- 4. Start a new church or a second worship site at a different location as a way of increasing attendance.

Follow Up with Visitors

- 1. Develop a systematic plan for following up with visitors after their first, second and third visits.
- 2. One model some use includes 1) Follow up with first time visitors with a doorstep visit before 3 p.m. that same Sunday, a letter or telephone call from the pastor within 2 days and placement on the newsletter and email lists; 2) Follow up with second time visitors with a telephone call within 36 hours from someone related to the visitor's interests or needs—for example, a Youth Minister, Sunday School Teacher or Choir Director; and 3) Follow up with persons who visit a third time with a telephone call to request a home visit.
- 3. Invite newcomers who have visited in recent months to an informal coffee with the pastor or other social gathering that includes fellowship and information.

Power-Packed Prayers for Public Schools

- Christian teachers. "Grant wisdom, Lord, for the Christian teachers in this school as they seek t olive out their faith. Help them be salt and light. Protect them from doubt and feat. Strengthen their faith by drawing them into Your Word, prayer and fellowship with other believers." (Heb. 10:25)
- 2. **Support staff.** "Father, may the social workers, psychologists, speech therapists, nurses, custodians, aides and other professional support staff treat students with dignity and respect. May all their interventions be based on truth and not on human theories." (1 Cor. 1:19-21)
- 3. **Special education decisions.** "Lord, may those involved in making decisions for children with special learning and emotional needs make those decisions based on what is best fo rthe child and according to what is right." (Is. 56:1)
