The Peanut

My son is allergic to nuts: pecans, almonds, walnuts, hazelnuts, etc. But it confuses people who know about his nut allergy when they see him eating a peanut butter cookie. I can understand this confusion, but you see, those 'tree nuts' that he's allergic to, grow on the limbs of trees, and the peanut, well, it's really not a nut at all, but a legume that grows under the ground. They start out as flowers on the lower part of oval and leaved plants. After the flowers are pollinated, they become heavy enough to bend to the earth, and a pod develops under the soil. It's more closely related to beans and peas, but of the legumes it's nutritional and culinary values are more like those of tree nuts.

Those peanuts are packed not only with protein that rivals tofu and beef, but they are healthy in other ways as well. The American Heart Association lists them as one of the 'better fats', as they contain mono-saturated fat, which helps lower 'bad cholesterol'. The Peanut Institute says that one ounce of raw peanuts contain 2.4 g of dietary fiber (lowers risk of heart disease and diabetes, as well as increases colon health), 2.4 mg of Vitamin E (anti-oxidant and protects nerve function), 68 mcg of Folic Acid (birth defect prevention, protects against cervical cancer and heart disease), 3.26 mg of Niacin (increases 'good' cholesterol as well as keeps nervous system, digestive system, skin, hair and eyes healthy), 48 mg of Magnesium (works with calcium to protect bones and teeth as well as reduces risk of heart disease).

As with all good things, moderation is the key. While peanuts are jam packed with nutrition and vitamins, serving sizes should be monitored as any fat, has 9 calories per gram and they can add up fast.

One wonderful aspect of peanuts are their shelf life. Unlike beef or chicken or fresh fish, peanuts keep well on a shelf, and as peanut butter, it's appealing to the taste palate of most American children

So while you're stocking up on your nuts this week, consider increasing the nutritional options for those less fortunate in your community. Grab an extra jar of peanut butter, or two and donate them to your local food bank or religious group that distributes food.

This month try a new legume, or try peanuts in a new way (sprinkle on a salad, add to stir fried veggies, eat them instead of popcorn at the movies). You'll be healthier for it.


