We look forward to seeing you in church!






FIVE GRAINS OF CORN

“Light of the World” Christmas Pageant



“The Light of the World” is a

Christmas Pageant performed by local residents of Minden, NE on the sides of the courthouse square every year. More than 100 Minden volunteers play centurions, angels, kings, and the Wise Men, as well as Joseph and Mary in a reenactment of the traditional Christmas story. Every performance is free of charge and culminates in the illumination of over 12,000 bulbs that adorn the courthouse and the square itself. The spectacular Christmas lights on the Kearney County Courthouse can be seen for miles. This year’s performance dates are Saturday, November 28 at 7:00 p.m., Sunday, December 6 at 7:00 p.m., and Sunday, December 13 at 7:00 p.m.

Faith’s **Mary Nuss**, 8:45 a.m. keyboardist, is one of the volunteers playing the part of Mary (and she is usually located on the west side of the square).

BUILDING ACCESSIBILITY UPDATE



Our building accessibility project is advancing! **THREE THINGS** have to happen in order for Faith UMC to proceed:

- ◆ Set of plans (blueprints are in Pastor Robert's office)
- ◆ Contract bid
- ◆ Plan for payment (total estimated costs \$538,560)

We already have \$459,770 from the estate of Warren and Betty Miller and other donations in the amount of \$3,975. We need a plan to cover the additional \$74,815 that the building accessibility addition will cost. **That's where our pledges come in.** We do not have to have the \$74,815 in hand — **we just have to have pledges showing that the money will be provided.** And your pledge does not have to be paid in one installment; it may be spread out over a period of time.

An easel in the back of the sanctuary is being used to track our pledge progress. Please prayerfully consider making a pledge for the Faith United Methodist Church A.D.A. Improvement Project. Thank you for your generosity.

The Power of the Bended Knee

Birds go to sleep on their perches, but they never fall off. This is because of the tendons in the bird's legs. They are so constructed that when the leg is bent at the knee, the claws contract and grip like a steel trap. The claws refuse to let go until the knees are unbent again. The bended knee gives the bird the ability to hold on to his perch so tightly.

Isn't this also the secret of the holding power of the Christian? Daniel found this to be true. Surrounded by a pagan environment, tempted to compromise with evil, urged to weaken his grip on God, he refused to let go. He held firm when others faltered because he was a man of prayer. He knew the power of the bended knee.

From sleeping birds we can learn the secret of holding things which are most precious to us—honesty, purity, thoughtfulness, honor, character. That secret is the knee bent in prayer, seeking to get a firmer grip on those values which make life worth living. When we hold firmly to God in prayer, we can rest assured He will hold tightly to us.





Donor Sabbath


DONATE THE GIFT OF LIFE

National Donor Sabbath is observed annually on Friday through Sunday two weekends before Thanksgiving. This three-day observance seeks to include the days of worship for major religions practiced in the United States:

2015: November 13 – 15

2016: November 11 – 13

2017: November 10 – 12



During National Donor Sabbath, faith leaders from many religions, donor families, transplant recipients, and donation and transplantation professionals participate in services and programs to increase awareness of the need for the lifesaving and enhancing gifts passed to others through transplantation and encourage people to sign up in their state registry as organ, eye, tissue, donors.

WHY NATIONAL DONOR SABBATH?

Today, most faith communities are supportive of organ donation and the individual choices of its members. Many view donation as an act of compassion and generosity. Since people often turn to their faith leaders for help when dealing with life and death issues, National Donor Sabbath provides an opportunity for faith communities to share their views and join in the conversation.

THE NEED KEEPS GROWING

While more than 120 million people are registered organ donors, we're all needed—because the need for organs keeps growing. Currently, more than 120,000 people are on the organ transplant waiting list.* But not everyone will receive an organ in time. Sadly, an average of 22 people on the list will die each day, waiting for organs. Those who donate organs, tissues, and blood stem cells restore hope and share gifts beyond measure.



Health Insurance Enrollment Event November 19th

Certified Navigators will be available to assist people in applying for health insurance through the healthcare.gov marketplace at an enrollment event on Thursday, November 19th from 9 A.M. until 4 P.M at the Help Care Clinic at 3015 Avenue A in Kearney.

Community Action Partnership of Mid-Nebraska (Mid) has certified Affordable Care Act Navigators who will be available to provide assistance in English and Spanish.

A Navigator is a an individual that's trained and able to help consumers as they look for health coverage options through the Marketplace, including completing eligibility and enrollment forms. Navigators are required to be unbiased and have a valid State of Nebraska Department of Insurance License. Their services are free to consumers.
