Groups like Open Table in Nashville, TN, provide housing to the homeless, but probably just as importantly, reveal God's presence in the people's lives. That in fact, God has been there all along, their intimate company on the long days and nights on the streets.

God is already at work in the world. And it isn't in making plans for its end next Thursday afternoon. God has always loved this creation including ample opportunity and time to figure out the blessings of this life and live it.

Knowing that you are a child of God means you also know that everyone else shares in this blessing. God's desire is that this lesson should change hearts and minds on how we are to treat one another.

As more and more people come to this realization and understand, then there will be a new heaven and a new earth by reconciliation and not destruction.

### You can't take it with you — but you can send it on ahead. "Store up for yourselves treasures in Heaven." Jesus, Matthew 6:20

Ever seen the bumper sticker "He who dies with the most toys wins"? Millions of people act as if it were true. The more accurate saying is "He who dies with the most toys still dies – and never takes his toys with him." When we die after devoting our lives to acquiring things, we don't win – we lose. The bumper sticker couldn't be more wrong.

I think of it in terms of a dot and a line. Our lives have two phases: one a dot, the other a line extending out from that dot. Our present life on earth is the dot. It begins. It ends. It's brief. But from that dot extends a line that goes on forever. That line is eternity, which Christians will spend in heaven. Right now we are living in the dot. But what are we living for? The shortsighted person lives for the dot.

The person with perspective lives for the line. This earth (and my time here) is the dot. My beloved Bridegroom, the coming wedding, the Great Reunion, and my eternal home in the New Heaven and New Earth – they're all on the line. The person who lives for the dot lives for treasures on earth that end up in junkyards. The person who lives for the line lives for treasures in heaven that will never end. Giving is living for the line.

We'll each part with our money. The only question is when. We have no choice but to part with it now. We can keep earthly treasures for the moment, and we may derive some temporary enjoyment from them. But if we give them away, we'll enjoy eternal treasures that will never be taken from us.

Nobody likes to talk to someone who isn't listening. I personally know how it feels to be sharing something from my heart to someone and have them look away or act like what I have to say is not important. When people talk to us it is important for us to respond appropriately.

What are some ways we can do that?

**Make eye-to-eye contact.** Listen intently not only with your ears, but also with your heart.

**Repeat** what the other person says to you when appropriate.

Don't allow outside distractions to pull you away. Stay focused.

Smile and nod your head as he or she speaks. A smile speaks loudly.

**Don't offer advice** until it is requested. And then speak gently.

**Try not to change the subject** or feel the need to tell them something similar that happened to you.




